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## Dear Parents/Carers.

As we come to the end of another successful year at Gordonbrock, I feel immensely proud of our children. Our amazing staff team has worked tirelessly to ensure that the children have enjoyed an enriching curriculum with many achievements to celebrate. From a wide range of trips to workshops in school, our musical performances and our successes in sporting events - it's been a brilliantly busy year! As always, the parents, staff and children have worked in firm partnership. Thank you for your ongoing support.

We are particularly proud of the many strengths recognised in our April 2024 Peer Review Report and we thought we would end the year by sharing some of the extremely strong feedback we received from the review team, as follows:

Behaviour across the school is impeccable and pupils are polite and helpful to one another as well as towards staff and visitors. They are caring and supportive of one another and this is very evident during group or pair work so that they contribute actively to one another's learning. Pupils are articulate and able to express their ideas, views and opinions well as a result of the school's work on personal development, including character development, and supporting its pupils to grow into confident and self-assured learners. It was clear from observations of their learning and conversations with them that, by the time pupils are in upper key stage 2, they have developed into mature, responsible young people who carry themselves with pride and are proud of their achievements. As a result of the school's work on diversity and inclusion, pupils have a powerful sense of their identity. Overall, the school's strong and positive ethos enables all to have a strong sense of belonging and to flourish as learners.

School leaders take a very strategic approach to continuous improvement and school development based on solid and accurate self-evaluation. They are reflective and innovative in supporting the school to grow and develop. Leaders make very good use of reliable and high-quality research to underpin initiatives













and they encourage all staff to look at relevant research to widen their knowledge and understanding. As a result, new initiatives, programmes etc. are very successfully rolled out helping the school to achieve increasing exceptionality in its work. The overall outcomes from national tests and assessments also point to exceptional work in core subjects and are a testament to the school's effectiveness. It was clear to reviewers, especially those who have been part of past peer-reviews that the school is the best it has ever been.

We hope you are as delighted with our Peer Review outcome as we are!

Many thanks, too, to FOG (Friends of Gordonbrock), who have worked so incredibly hard to raise significant funds for the school this year. The Summer Fair was a huge success and it was great to see so many of you there.

This time of the year in school always brings some farewells and we have some staff members who are leaving us.

Firstly, we are very sad to inform you that Carly Aylward is moving on to pastures new. She has been a highly-valued member of the team who started teaching at Gordonbrock in July 2018.
