NATHAN, Y4 In October, our concert hall was transformed into a professional music venue as a collective of London's finest professional international touring Black musicians came together to create a new musical ensemble for our young musicians.

In a new partnership Eliot Bank & Gordonbrock Federation x Lewisham Council's BHM Culture Events joined forces to create the band, 'Reclaiming Rhythms', with Roshan on Guitar, Lewis on Sax, Pat on drums, Mariam and Brad singing and Evander on Bass. Individual members of the band have achieved remarkable accomplishments, including performing on world stadium tours, reaching the semifinals on The Voice, collaborating with icons like Chaka Khan and composing music for films on Netflix. They've also been featured at the MOBO Awards, which celebrate Black music.

During our assemblies for KS1 and KS2, our young musicians had the opportunity to listen to the band perform a variety of genres, learning about the stories behind both the artists and the music. They explored Soul with Aretha Franklin, R&B rock ballads like Purple Rain, Disco with Sister Sledge's Lost In Music, Hip Hop with OutKast's Hey Ya, and Blues, Rock, and Soul with Proud Mary, made famous by Tina Turner.




